

Find us – by car Grid ref. SH726176

Please note Dolgellau is an old town built at the time of foot and horse travel. Many of the streets are therefore very narrow and care is required when driving. Once in Dolgellau we recommend that you do not use sat-nav to find us as this directs you along the narrowest streets.

From the South East - Take the M40 or M1 North then M6, M54, A5, A458 and A470 to Dolgellau.

From the South West - Take the M5 and M6 North then as above.

Take the first turning into the town on the left before the by-pass, continuing along this road (Pont yr Arran) until you cross the hump-backed bridge and enter the one-way system.

Follow the road (Porth Canol) into the town square taking the first turn left at J.P. & Son (household goods shop) into Meyrick Street. Continue to the wide staggered cross-roads at the end of the street. Go straight across Springfield Street and up the narrow street ahead signed "to Pen-y-Bank".

Follow this road up, ignoring the first turn into Upperfield Street. Due to the road closure continue up the steep road uphill and at the top turn right and head downhill. As you reach the crossroads at the bottom Ffynnon is the imposing stone building with large wrought-iron gates to your left.

From the North and East - Take the M6 and M56 to Chester then the A494 to Dolgellau.

Take the first turning into the town on the right before you reach the junction with the by-pass, continuing along this road (Ffordd Bala) until you see signs for the town centre.

Turn left over the large stone bridge and enter the one-way system along Ffos Y Felin. Bear right at the next junction on to Porth Canol into the town square.

Take the first turn left at J.P. & Son (household goods shop) into Meyrick Street. Continue to the wide staggered cross-roads at the end of the street and go straight. Go straight across Springfield Street and up the narrow street ahead signed "to Pen-y-Bank".

Follow this road up, ignoring the first turn into Upperfield Street and continue round to the right (do not take the very steep road uphill). Continue straight ahead and Ffynnon is the imposing stone building with large wrought-iron gates ahead of you.
